**Reverend John G. Forman**

Reverend Forman reported for Horace Greeley's New York Daily Tribune at the first National Woman's Rights Convention in Worcester, MA in 1850. He was a Universalist minister from West Bridgewater, MA. In addition he served on the Central and Social Relations Committees appointed by this convention.

Where could one look for more information? The Vital Records of West Bridgewater and local papers may be of help. The West Bridgewater library and historical societies may also be able to make some connections.

Why might Horace Greeley hire him as correspondent? Forman literally wrote letters describing the convention which Greeley published with little or no editing.
